

Case-study: Tele-consultation in Singapore






Patient's background

A 70-year-old Chinese patient, Jenny*, was diagnosed with final stage lung cancer in China. Following the diagnosis, she underwent surgery and was prescribed with the targeted therapy drug Tarceva. However, she subsequently developed drug resistance after a year of treatment. Her doctor in China suggested she do another surgery, but her family members were hesitant as they felt that a second surgery would be too invasive and have side effects she would not be able to tolerate due to old age.

After learning from Ulink's partner in China that many of the latest FDA approved drugs are available in Singapore but not yet approved in China, the patient's family decided to get a second medical opinion to find out more about other treatment options through a tele-consult with a Singapore oncologist.

Case-study: Booking the Tele-consultation





• Our partner reached out to Ulink with Jenny's enquiry, and Ulink replied with various treatment options.



• Ulink set up a mutually convenient timing for both Jenny and the doctor on the teleconsultation eplatform

1. Booking the tele-consultation



 Jenny chose her preferred doctor in Singapore out of two top oncologists recommended by Ulink. Ulink then sent Jenny's medical records to the doctor for a pre-assessment.

Case-study: Tele-consultation Follow-up



The family also conveyed their preference for less-invasive treatment, as Jenny's treatment in China made her very weak



Upon the patient's request, the doctor wrote a formal medical report with details of the assessment and diagnosis

2. During tele-consultation



During the session, the oncologist clarified more details with the family regarding the patient's medical history, to conduct a more in-depth assessment



The oncologist confirmed that the patient would be suitable for a treatment plan using the immunotherapy drug Opdivo, and explained the expected rate of efficacy

3. Post-consultation follow-up



The patient decided to undergo her first treatment in Singapore and continue her immunotherapy treatment in China if there were no side effects found

Summary: Tele-consultation in Singapore

Summary of outcome



Peace of mind

✓ Jenny's family was able to verify that the treatment prescribed by the physician in China was not optimal and learn about the more effective treatment options available and estimated costs, before committing to seek treatment overseas.



More affordable alternative

✓ Jenny and her family saved on unnecessary travel expenses (flights, hotels etc.) by tele-consulting with the doctor from the comfort of her home.



Reduce waiting time

✓ Jenny was able to skip long waiting times at her local hospitals to consult with a internationally-trained doctor, that was fluent in Chinese.



Easy follow-up

✓ With a written second medical opinion report, Jenny is better able to continue her new treatment plan in China, after the teleconsultation.

Estimated cost:

- ➤ Virtual consultation: Prices normally starts from S\$160 for a 20 minute consultation
- ➤ Written second medical opinion: Prices normally start from S\$500, the doctor can write a customised medical report and treatment plan based on the patient's preferred format
- ➤ Ulink case fee will apply to all arrangements: S\$200 per case

Dr. Daniel Tan is a radiation oncologist specialising in using radiosurgery and radiation therapy (SRS/SBRT) to treat cancers in the brain and spine, breast and prostate. He currently serves as the consultant radiation oncologist and medical director of Asian American Radiation Oncology (AARO), a newly established division of Asian American Medical Group, in collaboration with University of Pittsburgh Medical Centre (UMPC).

Dr Tan graduated from the National University of Singapore in 2002 and was awarded a Health Manpower Development (HMDP) fellowship by Ministry of Health (MOH) Singapore in 2008. He then went on to obtain another fellowship in 2011 at the Royal College of Radiologists, UK. Dr Tan was admitted as a Fellow of the Academy of Medicine of Singapore (radiation oncology) in 2012.

Dr Tan's research involves the application of SRS and SBRT in benign and malignant tumours of the brain and spine, as well as in oligometastatic and prostate cancers. His work has been presented at major international conferences and he is frequently invited to lecture on these subjects in regional meetings.


